

# House Bill 1 (HB1) Talking Points

- 1. Thank you for prioritizing education this session.
  - a. Including a proposed increase in per-pupil funding;
  - b. full-day Kindergarten;
  - c. restoration of professional development; and
  - d. increases in career and technical education.
- 2. We (KASS)/I look forward to working with you to ensure our children and our teachers can be at their best every day.
- 3. That's why I want to call to your attention <u>3 proposals</u> that would strengthen House Bill (HB) 1 and put Kentucky kids first.

#### a. Fully fund transportation:

- i. We need to ensure students can safely get to and from school in a timely manner without fear of delay or cancelled bus routes.
- ii. I've heard from many concerned parents about school bus delays and accessibility. (SUPERINTENDENT)

# iii. Use short personal story/experience (HOUSEHOLD/PARENT)

- iv. We need to fully fund transportation so that students across the state can focus on learning NOT worried about when they will get picked up and dropped off.
- v. As currently written, HB1 makes the problem worse, especially for larger school districts.

## b. Increase SEEK guarantee funding:

- i. When Kentucky public schools succeed, the Commonwealth succeeds.
- ii. The more we invest in our students now, the less we will need to spend in the future to catch up.
- iii. Unfortunately, public schools are chronically underfunded and have been for nearly 2 decades.
- iv. SEEK funding needs to increase to \$4,700+ to equal the 1990 SEEK guarantee base 32 years ago!

### c. Give school districts more freedom:

- i. Schools, superintendents and local leaders understand what works best for their students.
- ii. Education is not one-size-fits-all. Every county is different.
- iii. Our state government should not be in the business of picking winners and losers.
- iv. Instead, the Kentucky General Assembly needs to provide the resources to help schools and superintendents ensure student success in the classroom, workplace and community.
- 4. As you consider HB1, please know that all 171 school superintendents, representing every Kentucky school district, stand ready as a resource to help keep our promise to generations of Kentucky students—as we have for more than 70 years. (SUPERINTENDENT)
